


Corporate Cage-Free Ask for Sows

The sow production cycle lasts for around 150 days.

Sow stall



Farrowing crate



Sow stalls are banned after the first 4 weeks of gestation and farrowing crates are allowed. **Sows spend ~47% of their productive life in stalls and crates.**



Sow stalls are banned but farrowing crates are allowed. **Sows spend ~23% of their productive life in crates.**




Where there is no minimum legislation, **sows may spend their entire productive life confined in stalls and crates.**

Compassion is committed to the **elimination** of all cages for sows and is asking for:

The complete phase out of sow stalls¹ by 2027²

Replaced by group housing of sows throughout the dry period from weaning to one week prior to farrowing.

Key considerations for successful group housing of dry sows:




¹Sow stalls are banned in the UK (1999), but the UK imports pork products from the EU.

The complete phase out of farrowing crates by 2027²

Replaced with future-proofed, well designed, spacious free farrowing pens which do not allow for the temporary crating of sows.
